

**A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING FOR THE REDUCTION OF SALARIES OF THE TOWN SUPERVISOR AND
THE TOWN CLERK**

Local Law # 2 of 2016.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Scio, in the County of Allegany, as follows:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE AND INTENT

This local law provides for the reduction of salaries of the elected town officers of Town Supervisor of the Town of Scio, New York, and Town Clerk of the Town of Scio, New York, in order to reduce the cost to taxpayers of Town Government of the Town of Scio, New York.

SECTION 2. AUTHORITY

The Town Board of the Town of Scio enacts this Local Law under the authority granted by:

1. Article IX of the New York State Constitution, §2
2. New York Statute of Local Governments, § 10 (1)
3. New York Municipal Home Rule Law, § 10 (1)(i) and (ii), §10 (1)(a)(3), a §10 (2) and §23(2)(e).
4. Town Law §27(1).

SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS

In this local law:

“Town” shall mean the Town of Scio, New York.

“Town Supervisor” shall mean the elected town officer of Town Supervisor of the Town of Scio, New York, as embodied in Article 3 of the Town Law.

“Town Clerk” shall mean the elected town officer of Town Clerk of the Town of Scio, New York, as embodied in Article 3 of the Town Law.

SECTION 4. SALARY REDCUTIONS

1. Currently, the elected Town Supervisor of the Town of Scio, New York, is paid an annual salary of Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,500.00). Upon the effective date of this local

law, the Town Supervisor of the Town of Scio, New York, will be paid an annual salary of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00).

2. Currently, the elected Town Clerk of the Town of Scio, New York, is paid an annual salary of Eight Thousand Forty Dollars (\$8,040.00) and an additional sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) from the Town Water Department. Upon the effective date of this local law, the Town Clerk of the Town of Scio, New York, will continue to be paid an annual salary of Eight Thousand Forty Dollars (\$8,040.00) and will receive Zero Dollars (\$0.00) from the Town Water Department.

SECTION 5. PARTIAL INVALIDITY

If any section of this local law shall be held unconstitutional, invalid, or ineffective, in whole or in part, such determination shall not be deemed to affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE

This local law is subject to mandatory referendum and becomes operative as prescribed herein only if approved by the qualified electors voting upon the proposition. If the qualified electors voting upon the proposition approve the passage of this local law, then this local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
